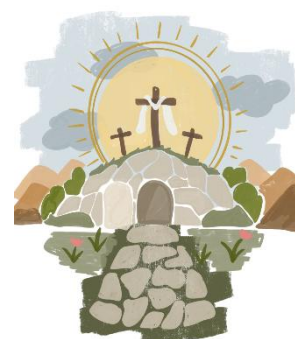

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Discussion on Parsonage. Maintenance Plus has given a quote for cleaning. Klint will reach out to them to arrange dates and times and exact pricing. Parsonage deck railing needs fixed and trees need to be removed or trimmed. A committee will be made to look at the parsonage and record all items that needs to be updated/fixed/replaced, etc. The report will be available at our next meeting.
2. Utilities at Parsonage – letterhead to SRT was emailed to them. Jerry Hennessy, Curt Schumaier, and Kylene Hornberger are named as the authorized parties for the account. The parsonage is now on vacation mode with reduced bill and the box and phone numbers will remain the same. Gary Gathman contacted the city.
3. Music rights: Kylene will check on our contract.
4. Synod. Discussion was held regarding the Synod and the lack of support given to Zion. The offerings being sent to the Synod are under council consideration. The council will continue this discussion at the April meeting.

Peanut Butter	Canned Soup	Canned Fruit	Canned Vegetables
Canned Stew	Canned Fish	Canned Beans	
Pasta (most prefer whole grain)	Rice (most prefer brown rice)		

These aren't the only items that food banks accept, however it covers most of what is requested. Some food banks accept personal care and household items, as well. CARPIO/ZION JOINT COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

The joint council meeting was held on March 2, 2025 at 12:00 pm in Carpio. Nine members from Zion council were present and five members from the Carpio council were present. The meeting was called to order by Carpio president, Jeff Moen. Pastor Heather opened the meeting with a prayer.

The joint council reviewed the minutes from the last meeting held on December 4, 2024. The council discussed the SAM and TEEM programs and determined the call process must be initiated prior to submitting a request to the Synod for Heather Feland to be accepted into the TEEM program. A motion was made by Chad Schweitzer to omit the sentence **"In February, the request will be submitted to the Synod for Heather Feland to be accepted into the TEEMS program."** from the December 4, 2025 joint council minutes. Ken Trail seconded, motion carries.

Old Business: Pastor Heather inquired how the council felt things were going with her as our full time SAM. Feedback was provided by council members: Church attendance has grown, positive comments were received regarding her sermons, kids are enjoying confirmation and retaining what is learned.

New Business: Counsel discussed providing benefits for Pastor Heather, and reimbursement for mileage in the interim until she is enrolled in the TEEM program. Motion was made by Ken Trail to provide Pastor Heather with one week of annual leave, one week of sick leave, \$300.00 per month to be split by Carpio and Zion, and mileage at the federal rate of \$.65 per mile for anything outside of normal church activity, all commencing March 1, 2025. Motion seconded by Marvin Heller, motion carries.

Call Process/Call Committee - Pastor Heather and Kurt Schumaier will work on scheduling a date and time for joint counsel to meet with Pastor Brad Dokken regarding the call process.

Council discussed the professional cleaning of the parsonage. Motion was made by Klint Hanson to move forward with the cleaning at a cost of \$1686.50 to be split between Zion and Carpio. Motion seconded by Jeff Moen, motion carries.

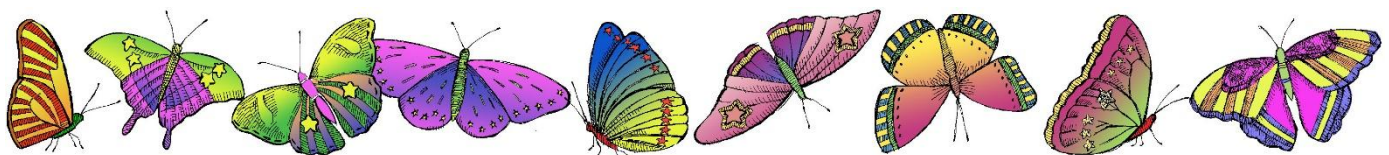

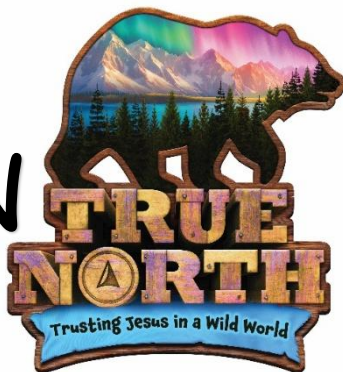
