The Apostle Paul writes to Titus the following guidance: "But as for you, teach what is consistent with sound doctrine. Tell the older men to be temperate, serious, prudent, and sound in faith, in love, and in endurance." (Titus 1:1-2) It's good guidance for all Christians, Old or Young, Men or Women. We are all walking billboards for God. The world is watching your life for clues to what makes you

As the Apostle Paul writes he offers wonderful advice, "be reverent in behavior, be self-controlled, and show yourself in all respects a model of good works." In teaching he says, "in your teaching show integrity, gravity, and sound speech that cannot be censured." Are you living up to your belief in Jesus? Is your teaching what Jesus would do? Are you the advertisement God needs you to be?

Check out the following advertisements. Each was actually printed in some local newspaper:

GEORGIA PEACHES, California grown, Eighty Nine cents a pound.

2 wire mesh butchering gloves; One 5-finger, one 3-finger. \$15 for the pair. Nordic Track \$300. Slightly used. Call Chubby.

Snow blower for sale, Only used on snowy days.

Nice parachute, never opened, used once.

OPEN HOUSE at Body Shapers Toning Salon, Free coffee and donuts.

The above advertisements don't really make the reader want to rush out and purchase the items for sale, do they? As a Christian, have you ever stopped to

think that you're a walking advertisement for Jesus Christ? Or A Walking Billboard for Christianity?

Let's take this a little deeper. Do the following areas of your life give a true advertisement of Jesus Christ living in your heart?

- #1. CONVERSATION: Is your chit-chat filled with gossip, rumors, criticism, or sarcastic remarks about others? Or, are your conversations filled with words that bring glory to Jesus Christ? You can be a true judge of this area of your life.
- #2. CLOTHING: Does what you wear and how you wear it cause others to question the depth of your relationship with Jesus Christ? Simply put, have you learned the art of remaining modest? You can be a true judge of this area of your life.
- #3. CHARACTER: Do you base your actions on "What Would Jesus Do? Can others trust you? Are you dependable? Are you honest? Do you live a life of integrity? Again, You can be a true judge of this area of your life.

God has given to all of us the opportunity to live life in the freedom of Jesus Christ, and yes, we are Free. But, that freedom is not to be lived in us doing what we want, wherever we are, or whenever we want. ## "COLABORATE: Lutheran Confirmation"

Carpio & Zion Lutheran Churches Confirmation Program for 8<sup>TH</sup> & 9<sup>TH</sup> Grade Youth

Welcome to the second year of the Revised Confirmation Program. We will be using "Colaborate" curriculum for Confirmation classes that challenge students to think theologically and to ask deep questions about the Bible, Lutheran History, and their lives as people of faith. "Colaborate" not only asks students to move boldly into the process of faith formation, but gives them the tools and the language to do so.

"Colaborate" curriculum is made up of 60 lessons. Each lesson confronts the students with a real question about the Bible, the Church, or Lutheran Doctrine, and then equips students to make thoughtful decisions about how they might answer it. This kind of problem based learning gets students engaged and helps them to see that faith formation is an ongoing process and not a one-time shot.

"Colaborate" uses punchy info graphics to help students get the ideas in each lesson by giving them mental muscle memory that allows both recognition and recollection of complex ideas. Our goal is to help each student come away from each lesson with a solid understanding of what it means to be a Lutheran, a Christian, and a Child of God.

<u>CLASS SESSIONS</u> begin Aug. 21<sup>ST</sup> at 6:30pm and end at 7:30pm each Wednesday, except during the Lenten season (Mar. 5<sup>TH</sup> – Apr. 9<sup>TH</sup>) when classes will start at 6:30pm and end at 7pm, for the 7pm Lenten worship service. We will alternate class locations as requested by the Church Councils of each congregation between Carpio and Berthold. Dates and locations are on the Schedule.

**ATTENDANCE** is expected for all Wednesday classes and for all Lenten Worship Services, except for an illness or if the Berthold Public School is cancelled or released early due to weather concerns. Missed class sessions require the student to complete the book lesson and show it to Pastor at student's next attendance. Pastor is available to help if called.

<u>REQUIRED MATERIALS</u> for each class session is a Bible (any version) and the "Colaborate" student work books. The Church Councils are asking that students pay 50% of the cost of the four workbooks that will be used for the two years of Confirmation classes. 8<sup>TH</sup> Grade students will pay \$36.13 that includes shipping & tax. 9<sup>TH</sup> Grade students already have books with sessions 3 & 4 for this year. If you lost your books, you will be required to purchase a new set.

**MEMORY WORK** is due on the date assigned and will be oral and not written. Bible verses may be from any version of the Bible. See the schedule for what is assigned and due each week. Adjustments will be made for students that learn differently.

**SUNDAY WORSHIP PARTICIPATION** is expected as often as possible. However, each student is required to serve as a worship assistant on 4 Sundays by Mar. 30<sup>TH</sup>, 2025. Assistants will arrive 15 minutes before worship to light candles, start live stream, handout bulletins, take offering, and read the Psalm of the Day. (Each Sunday only one student at each congregation will be serving as the assistant.)

<u>A FAITH STATEMENT</u> is required of all 9<sup>TH</sup> Grade students and is due by Wed. Apr. 9<sup>TH</sup>, 2025. Pastor will give directions & guidance on Ash Wednesday to help complete this assignment.

CONFIRMATION SUNDAY is May 4<sup>TH</sup>, 2025, for 9<sup>TH</sup> Grade students. (After 2<sup>ND</sup> Year of classes)
