"Love Breeds Life" Rev. George Schuessler

Ruth said to Naomi: "Do not press me to leave you or to turn back from following you! Where you go, I will go; where you lodge, I will lodge; your people shall be my people and your God my God. Where you die, I will die, there will I be buried. May the Lord do thus and so to me, and more as well, if even death parts me from you!" (Ruth 1:16-17) This expression of love is voiced over and over as Men and Women speak Vows during Wedding Services as they make covenants of love in the bonds of marriage.

During this month of February we will celebrate the covenant of love as we recognize Valentine's Day and give some token to the spouse or special friend or friends we love. But will you remember your God and the covenant of love He has made with you? "The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt, a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the Lord." (Jeremiah 31:31-32) In Christ Jesus, the very heart of God and his love for Humanity was poured out for you in your Baptism. A covenant of love made through the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

God truly does make a covenant of love with all of us. The Apostle Paul reminds us: "Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us, for it is written, 'Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree,' in order that in Christ Jesus the blessing of Abraham might come to the Gentiles, so that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith." (Galatians 3:13-14) Like wedding vows your baptism expresses such love between you and your God.

Yet, your baptism also gives expression to the gift of eternal life. As we are lifted from the water and are cleansed through the blood of Christ, we are also united with Christ in the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Covenant of Love expressed between Ruth and Naomi is the same Covenant of Love expressed between God and Humanity. It is a Love that is called "Grace." It is a love that is deep and broad, for Ruth and Boaz conceived and bore a son. "He shall be to (Naomi) a restorer of life and a nourisher of you old age; for your daughter-in-law who loves you, who is more to you than seven sons, has borne him." (Ruth 4:15) The child was named by the women of the neighborhood, "A son has been born to Naomi. They named him Obed; he became the father of Jesse, the father of David." (Ruth 4:17) Do you remember the Angel who spoke to the Shepherds near Bethlehem? "I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord." (Luke 2:10-11) Jesus is born out of a covenant of love.

Keep your covenant relationships of love pure for such love breeds life and when that covenant relationship of love is with God it breeds eternal life! Valentine's Day is not just a secular celebration day it is a Holy Day, a gift of God.

Berthold Zion Food Pantry

Have you ever thought about donating to "Feed the Children?" You do have an opportunity in your own community to be feeding the children. In the Berthold School there are children whose families are unable to pay in full for their children's meal tickets. I checked with the school secretary, Brittany, and asked her if the children who do not have their full meal ticket paid receive the same meal as everyone else? She said, "Yes!" The reason I asked this is because at some schools such children receive only a peanut butter sandwich with milk, which is very noticeable and really singles them out.

If you would like to help in covering the cost of these meals for the families that are unable to cover the full cost, you may donate money to the Berthold School by designating the money to the school lunch tickets and giving it to Brittany or by way of the Food Pantry by designating the donation, school lunch tickets, and I will give the money to Brittany. Breakfast tickets cost \$1.25 and lunch tickets cost \$2.00. You can be anonymous in your giving. Thank You for considering this special ministry in your own community.

I would like to also raise up another opportunity for feeding the children, and that is our own weekend backpacks for children who request them from the Berthold School secretary. We do not know who receives these backpacks, but each week Brittany calls and give the Berthold Zion Food Pantry the number of needed weekend backpacks. We started the school year with 7 weekend backpacks and are now at 13 weekend backpacks each week. Again, only Brittany know who receives these weekend backpacks of food.

These weekend backpacks are made identical and include 3 entrees, breakfast cereal, white and chocolate shelf milk in 8 oz. bottles, 2 containers of juice, cookies, cheese filled or peanut butter crackers, they may also have a pudding or fruit or applesauce or Jell-O cup, Pop Tarts, breakfast bars, fruit snacks, 2 small bags of chips, little bread sticks or pretzels with cheese dipping sauce, and some other treats as become available. When they are completely filled, the weekend backpacks weigh about 7 to 8 pounds each.

If you would like to help in the providing of these weekend backpacks, we have provided below a list of needed items that we put into the backpacks:
