"A BLESSED NEW YEAR" Rev. George Schuessler

For many New Year's Eve and New Year's Day are a marking of time, a moment to put into perspective what has been and to dream and make resolutions about what could be. Too many look at the transition from 2023 to 2024 as a passage of time in the rhythm of life as the old preacher would say, "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven." (Ecclesiastes 3:1) But the old preacher expresses this truth, "I know that whatever God does endures forever; nothing can be added to it, nor anything taken from it; God has done this, so that all should stand in awe before him." (Eccl. 3:14) In other words, perhaps we should put New Year's Eve and New Year's Day into the season of Christmas, into the receiving of the "Messiah", the "Christ", the Son of God!

The Apostle Peter puts it this way, "Do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like one day. The Lord is not slow about his promise, as some think of slowness, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish, but all to come to repentance." (2ND Peter 3:8-9) The Apostle John says, "Grace to you and peace from him who is and who was and who is to come, and from the seven spirits who are before his throne, and from Jesus Christ, the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of the kings of the earth. To him who loves us and freed us from our sins by his blood, and made us to be a kingdom, priests serving his God and Father, to him be glory and dominion forever and ever." (Revelation 1:4b-6) The Angel Gabriel announced to some shepherds in

the Judean countryside long ago, "Do not be afraid; for see, I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." (Luke 2:10-12)

Yes, New Year's Eve and New Year's Day are more than a marking of time, a reflection on the rhythm of time, and a dreaming of what should be. These days are part of the twelve days of Christmas. These days are for receiving and trusting in the awesome love and peace of God in the person of Jesus who is the "Alpha and the Omega, who is and who was and who is to come." (Rev. 1:8)

This New Year's renew or for the first time open your heart to receive the love and peace of God in the Babe of Bethlehem and leave all the "vanities" of the world behind. Let all of us join in the faith of the Psalmist who prays, "Long ago you laid the foundation of the earth, and the heavens are the work of your hands. They will perish, but you endure; they will all wear out like a garment. You change them like clothing, and they pass away; but you are the same, and your years have no end. The children of your servants shall live secure; their offspring shall be established in your presence." (Psalm 102:25-28)

You are a beloved child of God! Live secure in God's presence in 2024. The world's "vanities" will come and go, but rest assured and join the Apostle Paul and all the faithful witnesses who have gone before us in being convinced, "that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 8:38-39) Have a Blessed New Year of 2024!

With the mild winter we have had so far it doesn't seem like Christmas is only nine days away. We have had a very busy year as usual. Starting in the first part of January Ladora started her therapy twice a week. Her Physical Therapist name was Collin who was 25 years old, a.k.a., young whipper snapper, and George, a.k.a., drill sergeant both worked together as a team to get me to the point of no more needing to go to therapy. So after 20 sessions of therapy and I graduated to doing therapy at home.

I have also gone from needing to use the wheelchair to currently not even using my cane in the house. I also graduated from using a shower chair and having George be "Thing" from the Adams Family. Because I could not stand, George was positioned at the end of the shower curtain having to squirt the shampoo, lather up my shower puff, and operate the shower hose. It was really nice when I graduated to being able to shower myself without help and no chair.

I am so thankful for my husband who is a great caregiver for me. Also I'm thankful to be able to do most things by myself, just like I used to be able to do.

I have been able to return to my passion in life which is being the director of the Food Pantry and serving people. I have a new co-director, Carol Rovig. Barb Cooper retired and I very much am thankful for her years of service beside me. The Food Pantry continues to serve with an average of 15 families per month. We also put together 15 backpacks each week for children in the Berthold School who are in need of food over the weekend during the school year. Shelly Marum is my assistant with this project as well as Brittney Hanson, the school secretary who hands out the backpacks in the school. I also have other good volunteers who are the very best and are so eagerly willing to help me and the families we serve at the Food Pantry.

Last week a young TV reporter showed up at the Food Pantry when we were open. She asked if she could interview me and do a video for the news. My helpful volunteers all encouraged me and said I should do it. So I did it and it went well. In fact, people are asking George if he is married to a superstar celebrity. They are also asking me for my autograph. Pretty fun! (The link to the interview is to google, Berthold Zion Food Pantry Crystal Kwaw, link will be KFYR, if you want to check it out.) One of my volunteers ducked behind the shelves, but my co-director Carol stayed with me as we were stocking shelves.

It is really amazing the support we have from our community that we can give away thousands of pounds of food and other necessities needed for daily life. Also a big thank you to the City of Berthold and their generous gift of a warm, clean, one level, private entrance location in City Hall for the Food Pantry. They provide the room rent free and also cover the utilities so that all the funds that come to us may be used for the supplies needed to meet the needs of our families who use the Food Pantry.

Our vacations were spent with family in Wisconsin and some of the time was with family that came to visit us in North Dakota. We so appreciate and enjoy our families.

George's Mom and two brothers had some heart concerns this year, valves, stints, pacemakers, fortunately through faith in God and many answered prayers, all are doing well. George at his annual checkup made sure that the Doctor double checked his heart. Everything sounded good!

For the Thanksgiving weekend we had guests. Ladora's brother Bob with Renea and Andy, and Ladora's sister Margaret were able to join us for cards, good food, and great conversations. We were able to take part in the Great Thanksgiving Feast in the Carpio Lutheran Church hosted by our friends Cathy Armstrong and her daughter Heather Feland and their families. We all felt like a stuffed Turkey following the Feast. Oh, did I say we played lots of cards? Sure a lot of fun!

This year we lost two aunts. George's Dad's sister Clara at age 100 and Ladora's aunt Gertie who's prayers were answered when the Lord took her home. We also lost a very special friend and church organist, Alvis Martinson. These are all greatly missed.

Next year we look forward to a couple of milestones with the 40^{TH} Anniversary of George's Ordination into Ministry and also the 40^{TH} Anniversary of our Marriage.
