“Rejoice In the Abundance of Change” *Rev. George Schuessler*

The old Preacher in Ecclesiastes 3:1 writes: “For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven.” Fall has arrived rejoice in its magnificence of beautifully colored valleys, abundant harvests, an exciting “Homecoming” football victory, gracefully played volleys placed over the net for joy of a well-executed play, leading us to a great Thanksgiving. As the old Preacher writes he reminds us of the many changes that occur in the seasons of life and of the toil and surprising joys and sorrows in life.

Needless to say, we are seldom bored as we experience the turning of the world and the many seasons that it brings into our midst. And truthfully we are more often blessed with great joy than with sorrow. Why? God journeys with us through each and as we have learned through each season, there is life in surprising abundance and in magnificent beauty for each season. There really is time and reason for us to rejoice in Fall, Winter, Spring, and Summer, in Adulthood, as Seniors, Children, and Youth, at birth, in life, through death, and in the risen eternal life with Christ Jesus. For sure their challenging changes, but also abundant blessings beyond imagination, and certainly joy that is truly out of this world, so do not bemoan fall by look back at summer or by looking forward to winter, simply rejoice in the abundance of chance in this moment in time and enjoy what gifts and life God blesses **YOU** with!

Therefore, let us all rejoice in the abundance of change and pray: Father in heaven equip us with both wisdom of beloved traditions and fresh ideas; grant us joy in our tasks of living; renew us daily in the seasons of life in your Word, Jesus Christ, who is among us in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen!
